

Shining Bright

It is Robert's first day of work, a day he thought would never come. He is nervous. Excited. Hopeful.

He steps out of Oliver Gospel's blue front door and begins to make the short walk to a local church, where he has been hired to do maintenance work full time. Memories of his past echo in Robert's mind with each step.

"We were in the streets around drugs, addicts, and shootings. People were selling drugs, taking your stuff. It was hard growing up."

Back then, Robert sold drugs to make ends meet and used drugs to numb his pain and loneliness. Eventually, this landed him in prison for 10 years. When he was released, Robert was determined to change his life, but the temptation to fall back into old ways was strong. His brother called Oliver Gospel, knowing that what Robert needed most was support and help.

Robert remembers thinking all he would get from Oliver Gospel was a bed and a bite to eat. What he didn't know was that his life would change forever when he walked through that blue door.

The food and shelter were a great relief, but it was the program itself that really changed Robert. The recovery classes empowered him to overcome his addiction, and the one-on-one counseling sessions dealt with trauma from his past. He began working with a reading comprehension and speech instructor to improve his communication skills. He gained valuable skills through his work therapy assignments and career classes.

The turning point in Robert's life was when he found Jesus. He began to regularly attend church for the first time since his childhood, building a strong, supportive community. Robert's life coach even drove him to the hospital to pray over his sick mother. When she recovered the very next day, Robert was amazed at God's faithfulness.

"That showed me love right there. It wasn't just about the program; it was about me and my family's well-being, too."

All of this led him to this job at the local church – the classes gave him skills and confidence, and his love for Jesus gives him hope and joy. As Robert climbs the steps to the church for his first day on the job, he can't help but smile. His journey may have been difficult, but he doesn't have to worry - his life is in Jesus' hands.
